#### 6. Items for discussion

a. 40th Anniversary of HGRG

Celebrated with an afternoon of speeches and a cake etc. Great success, thanks to all involved.

b. HGRG-sponsored biennial conference

The proposal CG tables is to institute an HGRG sponsored biennial conference. The idea being host organizations propose a theme, this is backed by the committee, with some HGRG funds given as well as organizational help.

Hayden Lorimer notes that in the past this day conference has been run the day after the PHG conference to great effect.

Alaistair Owns suggests the need to make it clear how much money, ie. An upper limit is put on the amount of funds HGRG will offer.

The AGM passed the proposal by 25 votes

c. HGRG 'legacy' fund

This issue needs to be raised with RGS who have a longer philanthropic tradition. It was noted, especially in wake of 40<sup>th</sup> birthday celebrations that there was seen to be significant good will amongst the membership for the research group.

d. HGRG international membership and representation

CG suggested we should re-instigate an international HGRG position to help laise with Historical geographers beyond the UK.

Graham Wynne once had this role.

FD reported it had been a successful position in the past.

It was agreed that this was something to think about.

e. Maintaining HGRG archives – update

CG reported that this was an ongoing project, RHED had indicated some money would be available, but that this was dependent on the research group producing a report for all research groups about archiving their work.

f. Teaching Historical Geographies – update

Carl provided a report from Nicola Thomas on the GEES funded project that will see Kevin Milbourne and her touring departments and making videos and pod-casts of historical geography teaching to produce resources to share.

g. International Benchmarking Review – recommendations

The meeting formally thanked Felix Driver for his work on the bench marking document.

Carl reported three key concerns/ recommendations:

- a) That HG was not only becoming a smaller community in the UK, but that there were increasing numbers of lone scholars and lone PhD students working, this increased the need to ensure good and effective networking and support mechanisms. PHG is a good example of the work the research group already do in this area.
- b) It was noted that there was a reduced ability to apply for small research grants, which was an issue in a field that needed to support young scholars, and all scholars, but which also often did not large sums of research money.

HGRG does have a series of research grants, and so do the RGS

## c) Language issues

The issue was raised regarding the contraction of language skills amongst Historical Geographers.
